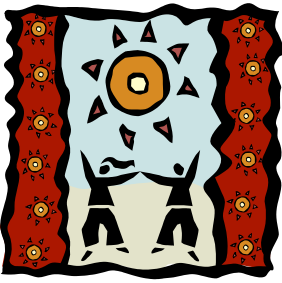
Entering 7th Grade Summer Reading Requirements:

Anderson, Laurie Halse

Chains: Seeds of America

After being sold to a cruel couple in New York City, a slave named Isabel spies for the rebels during the Revolutionary War.

Applet, Kathi

The Underneath

2009 Newbery Honor Book! An old hound that has been chained up at his hateful owner's run-down shack and two kittens born underneath the house, endure separation, danger, and many other tribulations in their quest to be reunited and free.

Bartoletti, Susan Campbell *The Boy Who Dared*

In October, 1942, seventeen-year-old Helmuth Hübener, imprisoned for distributing anti-Nazi leaflets, recalls his past life and how he came to dedicate himself to bring the truth about Hitler and the war to the German people.

3 Willows: The Sisterhood Grows

Ama, Jo, and Polly, three close friends from Bethesda, Maryland, spend the summer before ninth grade learning about themselves, their families, and the changing nature of their friendship.

Cashore, Kristin

Graceling

In a world where some people are born with extreme and often-feared skills called Graces, Katsa struggles for redemption from her own horrifying Grace, the Grace of killing, and teams up with another young fighter to save their land from a corrupt king.

How We Know What We Know About Our Changing Climate: Scientists and Kids Explore Global Warming

A great book that explores the science behind climate change and where scientists look for clues.

Collins, Suzanne

The Hunger Games

In a future North America, where the rulers of Panem maintain control through an annual televised survival competition pitting young people from each of the twelve districts against one another.

Connor, Leslie

Waiting for Normal

Twelve-year-old Addie tries to cope with her mother's erratic behavior and being separated from her beloved stepfather and half-sisters when she and her mother go to live in a small trailer by the railroad tracks on the outskirts of Schenectady, New York.

Deem, James M. ***Bodies From the Ice: Melting Glaciers and Rediscovery of the Past***
Recounts the discovery of the oldest human mummy in the 1990s by two mountain climbers on the Austrian border, in this exciting volume that reveals how glaciers, hulking masses of moving ice, are now offering up many secrets from the past.

Delano, Marfe Ferguson ***Helen's Eyes: A Photobiography of Annie Sullivan, Helen Keller's Teacher***

Denenberg, Barry ***Lincoln Shot: A President's Life Remembered***
A fictitious/biographical account of Lincoln's death "one year" after he was shot. This book is designed to look like a commemorative newspaper of the time.

Doctorow, Cory ***Little Brother***
After being interrogated for days by the Department of Homeland Security in the aftermath of a major terrorist attack on San Francisco, California, seventeen-year-old Marcus, released into what is now a police state, decides to use his expertise in computer hacking to set things right.

Dowd, Siobhan ***The London Eye Mystery***
When Ted and Kat's cousin Salim disappears from the London Eye ferris wheel, the two siblings must work together--Ted with his brain that is "wired differently" and impatient Kat--to try to solve the mystery of what happened to Salim.

Engle, Margarita ***The Surrender Tree: Poems of Cuba's Struggle for Freedom*** Cuba has fought three wars for independence, and still she is not free. This history in verse creates a lyrical portrait of Cuba.

Fleischman, Sid ***The Trouble Begins at 8: A Life of Mark Twain in the Wild Wild West***

Freedman, Russell ***Washington at Valley Forge***
Washington's army nearly perished during the winter of 1777-78. Camped at Valley Forge, the revolutionaries endured severe hardship. The army's supply system had collapsed and they were without supplies. But when the harsh winter ended, the soldiers had survived, and marched away from Valley Forge more determined than ever.

Gaiman, Neil ***The Graveyard Book***
2009 Newbery Award winner! Nobody Owens is a normal boy, except that he has been raised by ghosts and other denizens of the graveyard.
Coraline – Enjoy a scare? Read Gaiman's creepy graphic adaptation of the novel.

Goodman, Alison ***Eon: Dragoneye Reborn***
Sixteen-year-old Eon hopes to become an apprentice to one of the twelve energy dragons of good fortune and learn to be its main interpreter, but to do so will require much, including keeping secret that she is a girl.

Gratz, Alan ***Brooklyn Nine: A Novel in Nine Innings***
In loosely connected chapters, Gratz examines how one Brooklyn family is affected by the game

of baseball.

Hiaasen, Carl ***Scat***

Nick and his friend Marta decide to investigate when a mysterious fire starts near a Florida wildlife preserve and an unpopular teacher goes missing.

Ibbotson, Eva ***The Dragonfly Pool***

Tally, a twelve-year-old English girl, and her classmates at Delderton, a progressive boarding school, help Karil, the young prince of Bergania, escape into England after the Nazis invade Bergania and kill the king.

Jinks, Catherine ***Genius Squad***

Sequel to ***Evil Genius***. After the Axis Institute is blown up, fifteen-year-old Cadell Piggot is unhappily stuck in foster care with constant police surveillance to protect him from the evil Prosper English until he gets an offer to join a mysterious group called Genius Squad.

Lockhart, E. ***The Disreputable History of Frankie Landau-Banks***

Sophomore Frankie starts dating senior Matthew Livingston, but when he refuses to talk about the all-male secret society that he and his friends belong to, Frankie infiltrates the society in order to enliven their mediocre pranks.

Macaulay, David ***The Way We Work: Getting to Know the Amazing Human Body***

Explores the complex inner workings of the human body in a visual study of anatomy and physiology that ranges from the cells that form the building blocks of the body, to the individual organs and systems and how they function.

Mass, Wendy ***Every Soul a Star***

Ally, Bree, and Jack meet at the one place the Great Eclipse can be seen in totality, each carrying the burden of different personal problems, which become dim when compared to the task they embark upon and the friendship they find.

Murdock, Catherine Gilbert ***Princess Ben***

A girl is transformed, through instruction in life at court, determination, and magic, from sullen, pudgy, graceless Ben into Crown Princess Benevolence, a fit ruler of the kingdom of Montagne as it faces war with neighboring Drachensbett.

Myers, Walter Dean ***Sunrise Over Fallujah***

Robin Perry, from Harlem, is sent to Iraq in 2003 as a member of the Civilian Affairs Battalion, and his time there profoundly changes him.

Naidoo, Beverly ***Burn My Heart***

Matthew and Mungo, boys with a different skin color and culture, have a friendship that is tested during the Mau Mau bid for national independence.

Pearson, Mary E. ***The Adoration of Jenna Fox***

In the not-too-distant future, when biotechnological advances have made synthetic bodies and brains possible but illegal, a seventeen-year-old girl, recovering from a serious accident and suffering from memory lapses, learns a startling secret about her existence.

Pratchett, Terry ***Nation***

After a devastating tsunami destroys all that they have ever known, Mau, an island boy, and Daphne, an aristocratic English girl, together with a small band of refugees, set about rebuilding their community and all the things that are important in their lives.

Reeve, Philip ***Here Lies Arthur***

When her village is attacked and burned, Gwyna seeks protection from the bard Myrddin, who uses Gwyna in his plan to transform young Arthur into the heroic King Arthur.

Riodian, Rick ***The Last Olympian*** - Latest in the Percy Jackson and the Olympians series! While the Olympians struggle to contain the rampaging monster Typhon, Kronos begins his advance on New York City, where Mount Olympus stands virtually unguarded. Now it's up to Percy Jackson and an army of young demigods to stop the Lord of Time.

Sandler, Martin W. ***Lincoln Through the Lens: How Photography Revealed and Shaped an Extraordinary Life***

Scott, Michael ***The Sorceress*** - The latest title in the **Secrets of the Immortal Nicholas Flamel** series (***The Alchemyst, The Magician***)

Tan, Shaun ***Tales From Outer Suburbia***

Fifteen illustrated short stories, some humorous and some haunting, set in the Australian suburbs.

Turner, Pamela S.. ***Life on Earth--and Beyond: an Astrobiologist's Quest***

Werlin, Nancy ***Impossible***

When seventeen-year-old Lucy discovers her family is under an ancient curse by an evil Elfin Knight, she realizes to break the curse she must perform three impossible tasks before her daughter is born in order to save them both.

Wood, Don ***Into the Volcano***

While their parents are away doing research, brothers Duffy and Sumo Pugg go with their cousin, Mister Come-and-Go, to Kokalaha Island, where they meet Aunt Lulu and become trapped in an erupting volcano.

Nelson, Scott Reynolds ***Ain't Nothing But a Man: My Quest to find the Real John Henry*** – The historian and biographer searches for the truth about strong man, John Henry.
